



Dear Parent,  
Greetings!

We missed the presence of the parents who could not attend the 1<sup>st</sup> open house meeting for classes VI –VIII held on 28<sup>th</sup> April 2018 from 9 am to 10 am in the school premises. Summary of the discussion is as follows:

1. To brief the parents about the latest examination pattern of CBSE, several aspects related to examination like marks for PA, note book submission, and subject enrichment activities were highlighted upon by the Exam In charge of Classes VI-VIII.
2. In the meeting the importance of attendance, sincerity, behaviour and values in character building with special reference to discipline as a deciding factor in grading the students in co-scholastic area were stressed upon.
3. The parameters for awarding scores for notebook correction including regularity, completion of work, neatness and meeting the deadlines in submission of notebooks were highlighted.
4. Maintenance of log sheets to avoid class bunking was highlighted. Measures in the form of detention and doing community service by the defaulters as per the school discipline policy were stressed upon.
5. On the issue of parents receiving wrong messages and incorrect timings from the RFID card of their wards it was told that such matters are promptly taken up with the service provider and resolved on priority basis whenever such complaints have been reported.
6. The school already has a procedure for re-evaluation of answer scripts for annual examinations. Parents who wish to apply for re-evaluation or see their ward's answer scripts may contact the I/C Exams and follow the necessary procedures. The suggestion of handing over answer scripts to all students as a common policy is being reviewed by the examination cell and parents would be apprised soon.
7. For the big gap which prevails between the break and the afternoon dispersal time it was stressed that most of the students do not come to school having proper breakfast because of which the break time has been fixed after the 3<sup>rd</sup> period. Also the break periods are different for different classes to avoid rush in the school cafeteria.
8. The school recognizes the multiple benefits of life skill training imparted to students. In line with the same sensitization session for students have been organized on the lines of POCSO Act and Juvenile Justice Act. Moreover, during the academic year certain adolescent and other age related issues would be touched upon for the benefit of the students.
9. On the issue of increasing swimming classes, it was told that the school maintains a balance by laying equal emphasis on class drills, march-past, yoga and swimming together which have been timetabled as per CBSE guidelines.
